PSD Announces New Human Resources Executive Director, New Chief Financial Officer

Gig Harbor, WA – Superintendent Bahr is pleased to announce two new members to the district's leadership team. Dan Dizon will serve as the new Human Resources Executive Director, beginning July 1. Current Executive Director Caroline Antholt is retiring in June after many years with the Peninsula School District. PSD also named Ashley Murphy as the new Chief Financial Officer starting on July 1. The current Chief Financial Officer, Karen Andersen, is retiring August 31, 2022.

Dizon was selected from a strong pool of applicants after an extensive interview process with many of PSD's stakeholders and the superintendent before being chosen for the role of Human Resources Executive Director.

"Our team is excited about the wealth of experience and knowledge Dan Dizon will bring to the role," Peninsula School District Superintendent Krestin Bahr said.
